November Mock Election

The Student Council, organized in 1947, has as its goals: to promote better understanding between faculty and students, to encourage scholarship, to foster loyalty to the school, and to help students become better citizens.

The student elected council, governed by its own constitution, develops rules for the regulation of school activities, approves events to be placed on the school calendar, and keeps an accumulative record of extracurricular activities throughout the year. The Council at all times works with the Board of Education, the school administrators, and its advisor.
