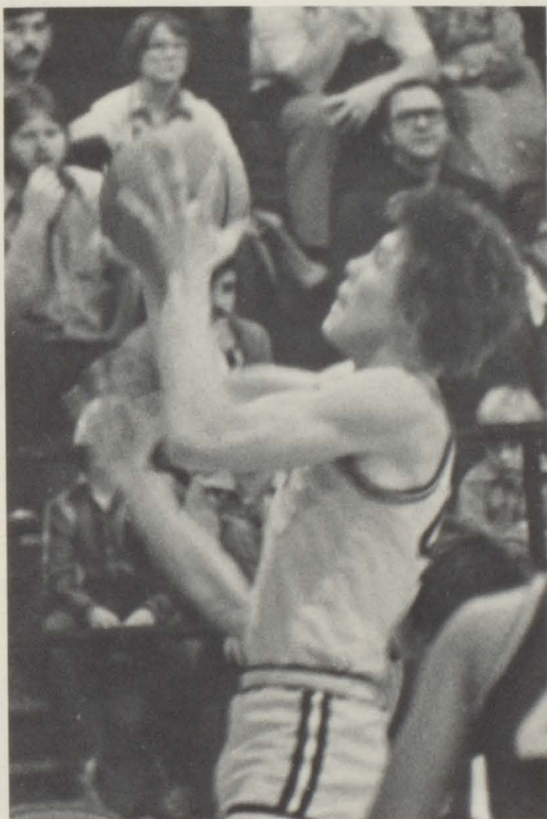

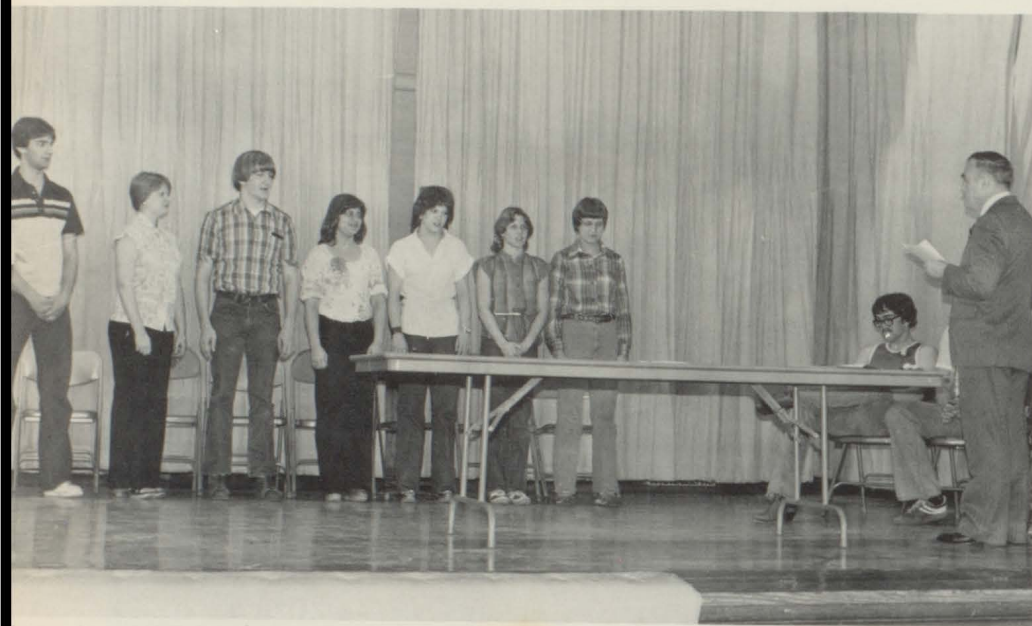

"Yes, we do. Admit failure."

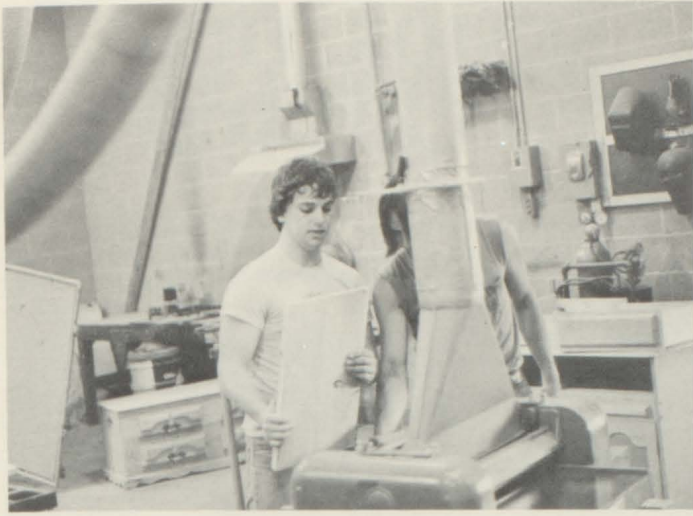
Unable to locate their client, the two clones instead report to Mr. David Paterson. "And", finishes LC, "we cannot locate the school mascot."

"Yes," agrees BC. "Some even went back for seconds."

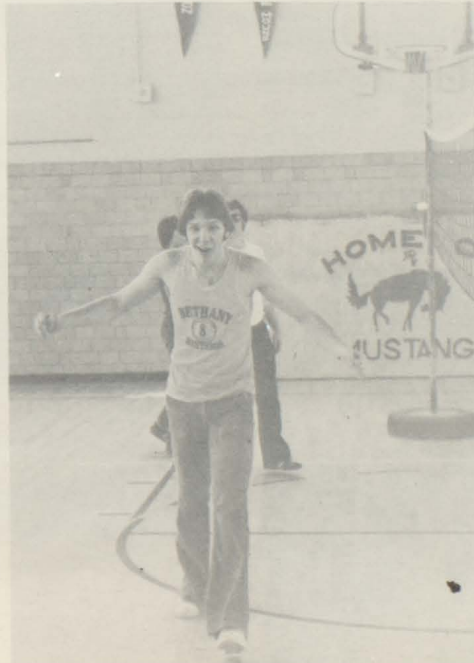
"Just think," LC goes on. "From school mascot to school lunch in one day!"
