The delicious roast beef sandwiches we're having tonight are furnished by Paula Hower, owner of the local Rax restaurant.

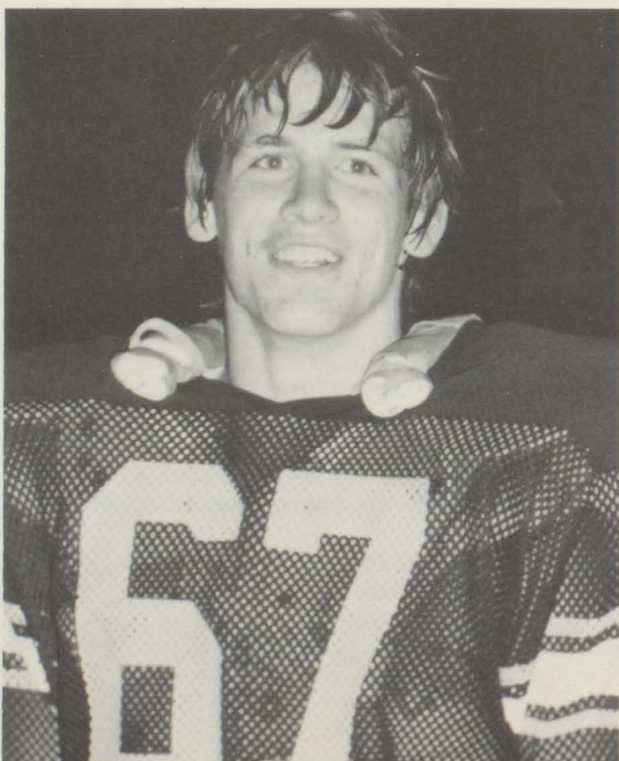
JoEllen Faith is here looking a year younger than everyone else.
