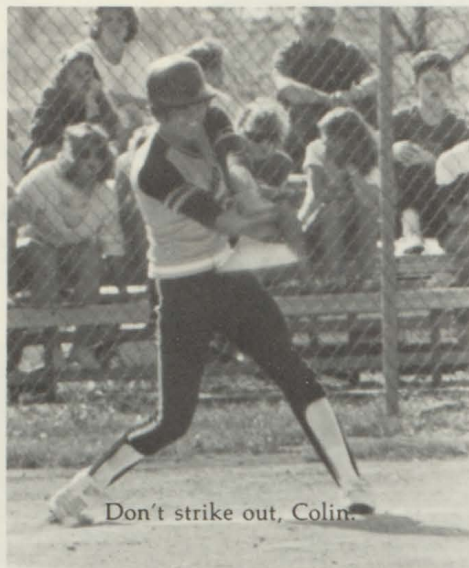


# Mustang Baseball 12-9: Best Record In A Decade

## THE TRADITION CONTINUES

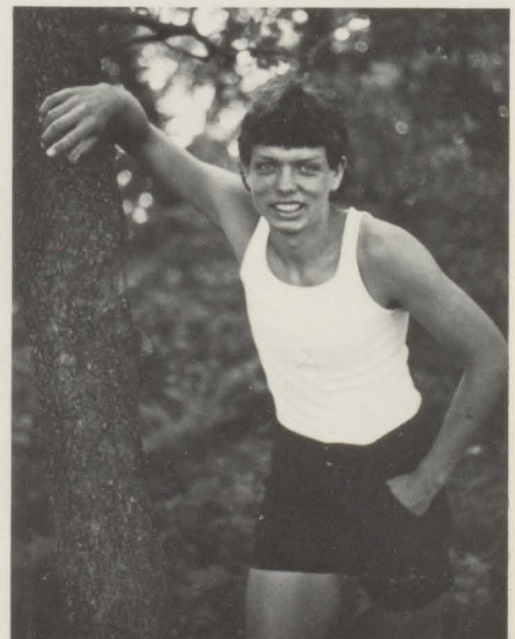

We had many successful activities (boys basketball and scholastic bowl) and some not so successful (boys football and girls softball). But, we tried hard!

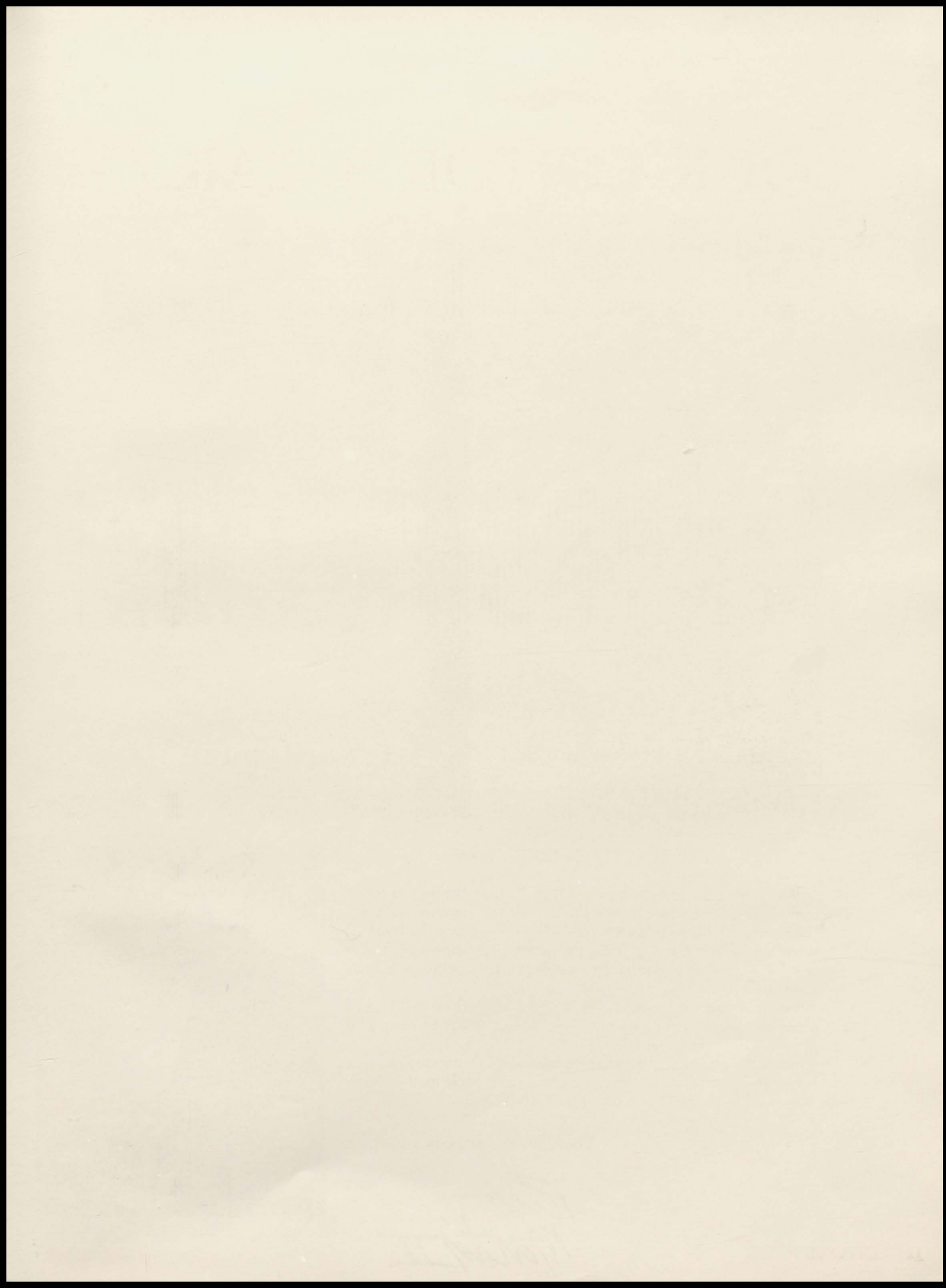
All these and many more memories are put together in this book. Hopefully, in 20 years you can look back in this book and think 1986-87 was truly a traditional year.
