












MORE FOLLIES




Mustang Baseball 12-9: Best Record In A Decade


The Bethany High School baseball team had an impressive season with a 12-9 record. Coach Inman said, "It's the most wins in at least a decade."

YEARLING CAGERS

















7th Grade Takes 4th In State 8th Grade Slumps From Lack Of People




Ryan Martin, new state long jump record holder, with a jump of 18'3".

Ryan and Steve VanLoon ran the 400m and 200m, respectively, at the state meet. The 7th graders also won their regional meet. The 8th grade didn't do as well, largely due to a small squad. 


NHS Classics


Lettermen Carry On Tradition


MARCHING **MUSTANGS**
