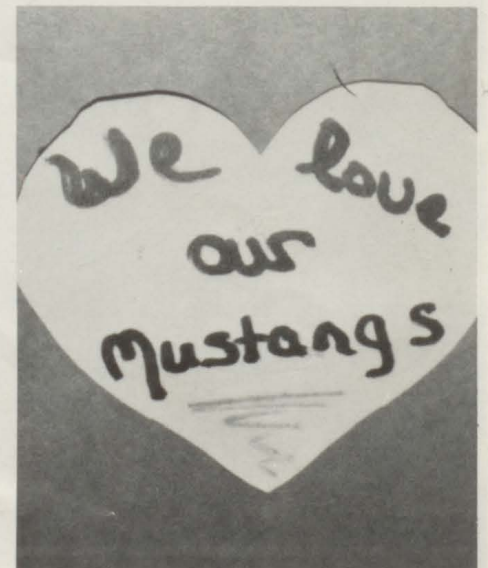
A Sure Sign Of Improvement

After the game, many students watched the crowning of the king and queen, Lance McCain and Melissa Moody, at the annual homecoming dance.



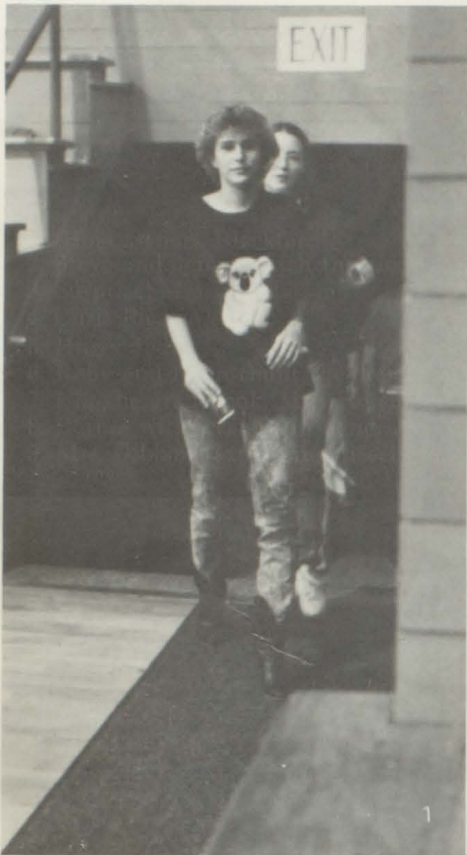

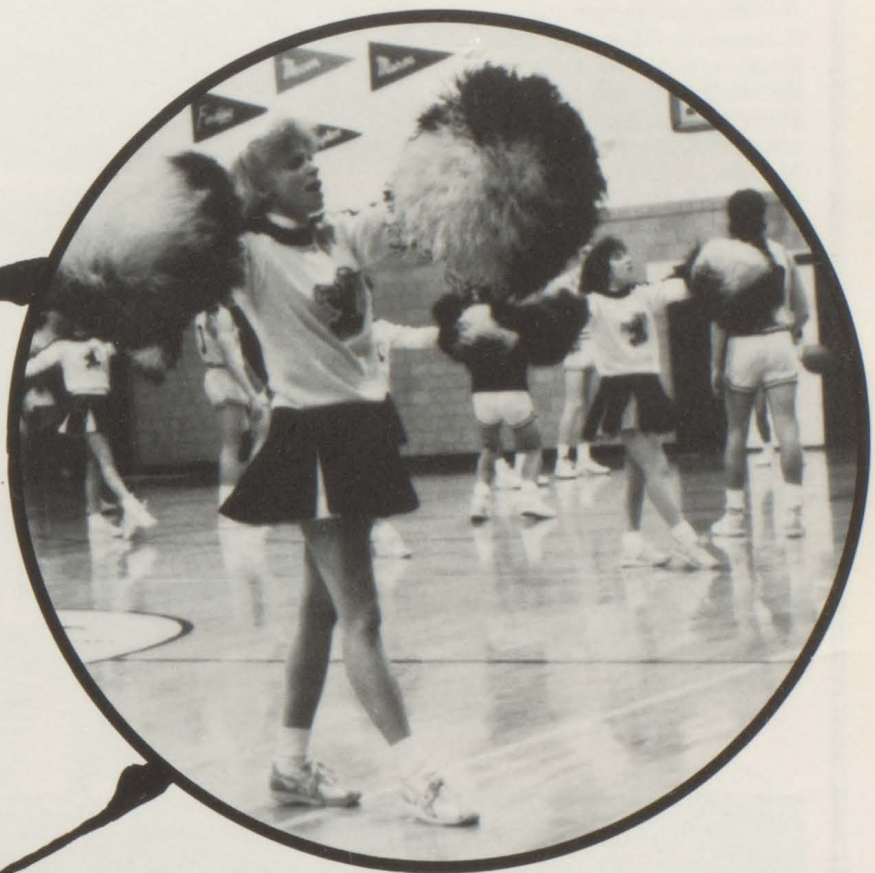
