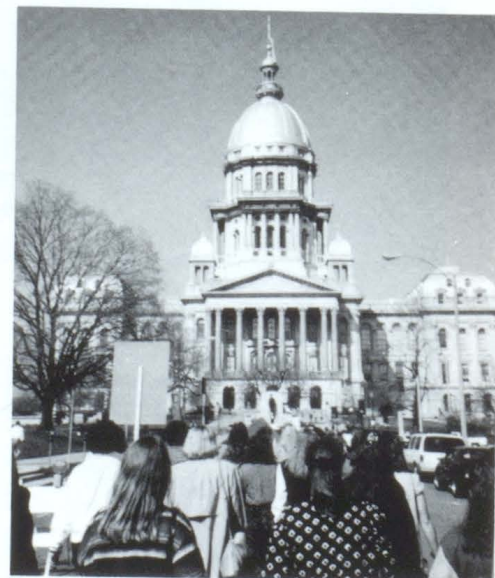

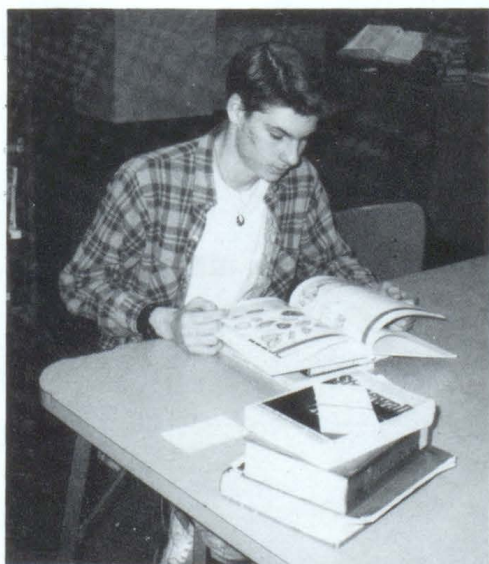

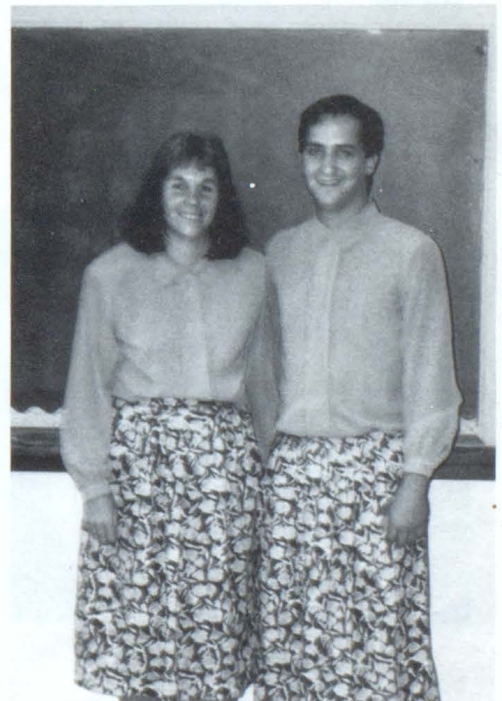


Coach Lawrence claps for his team as they pull ahead of the St. Teresa Bulldogs. This was the first big win of the year for the boys.

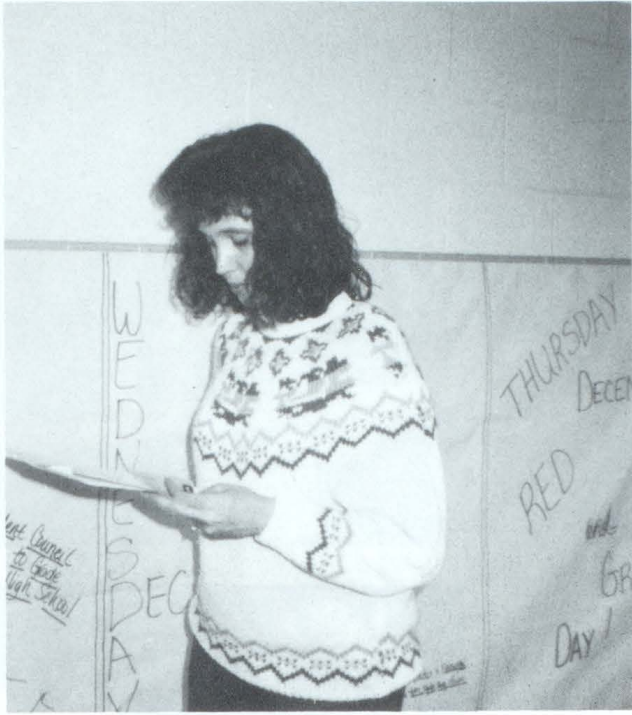

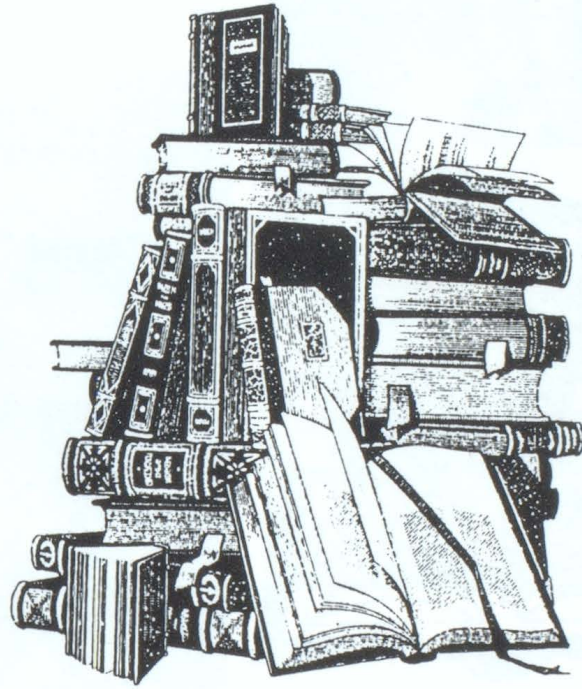

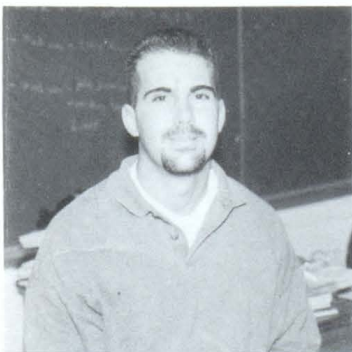

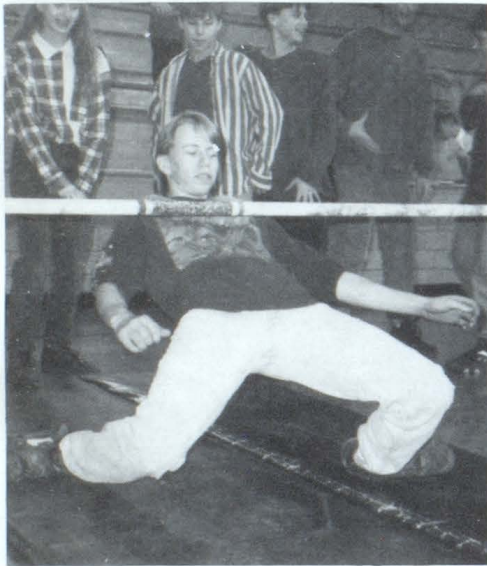

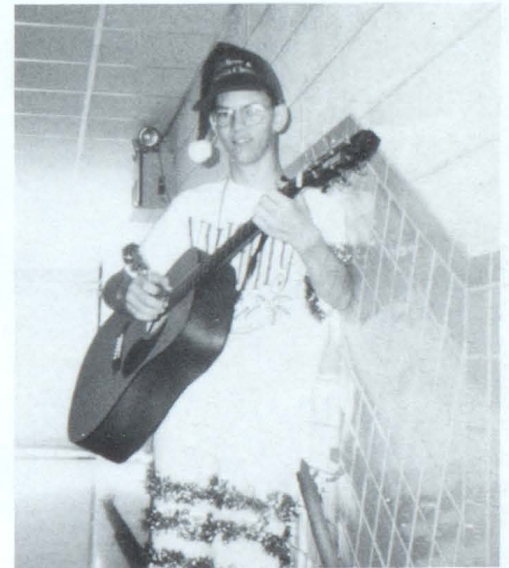

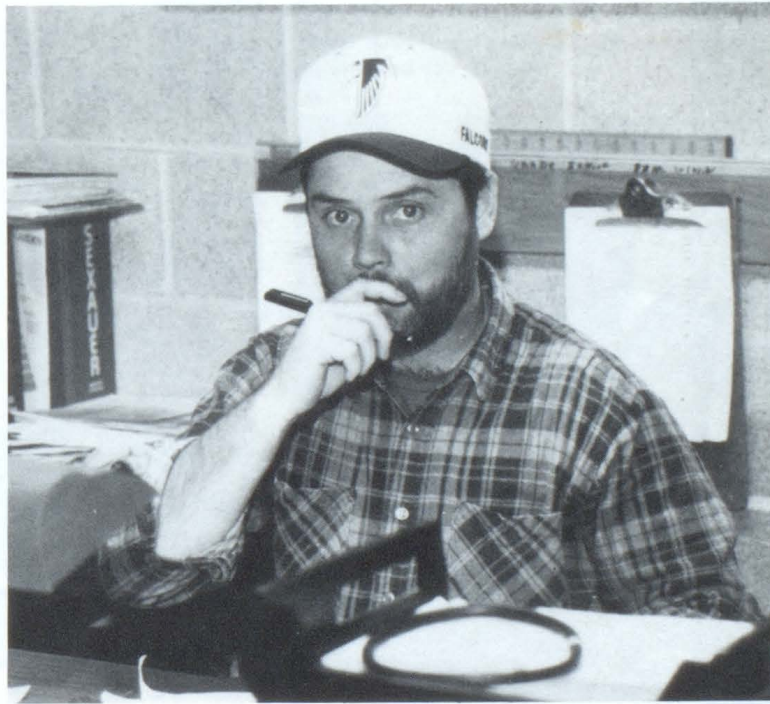

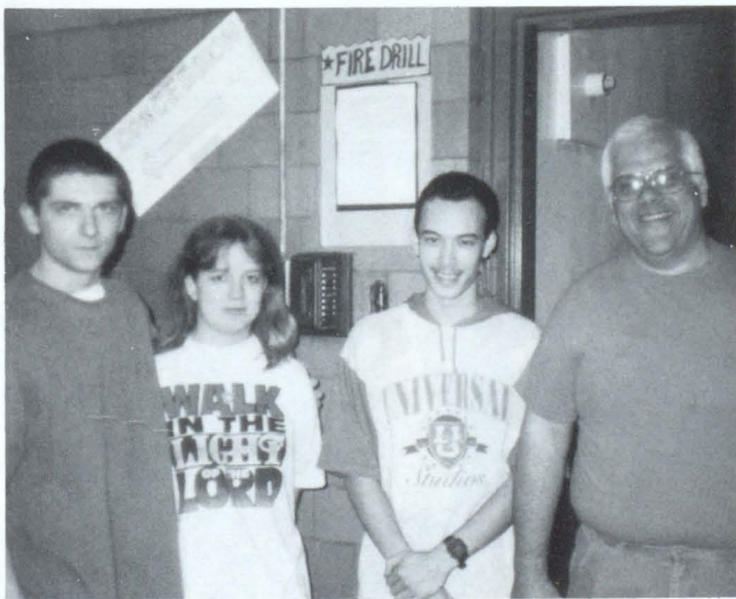

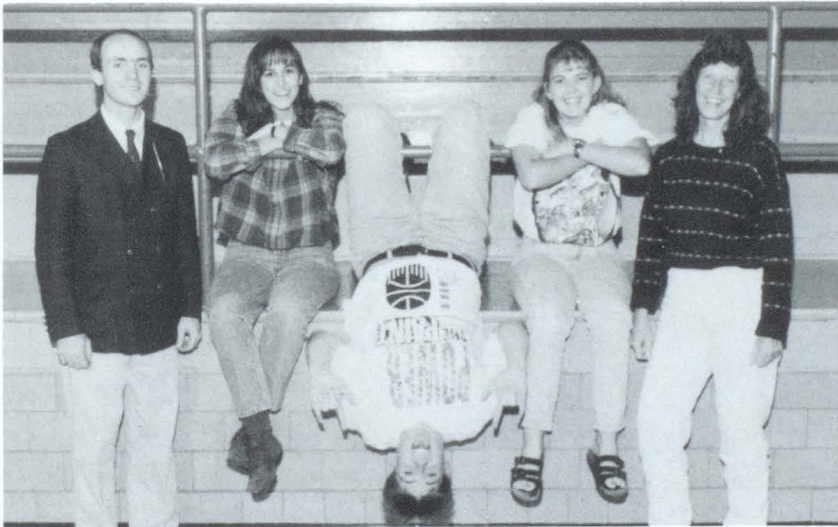

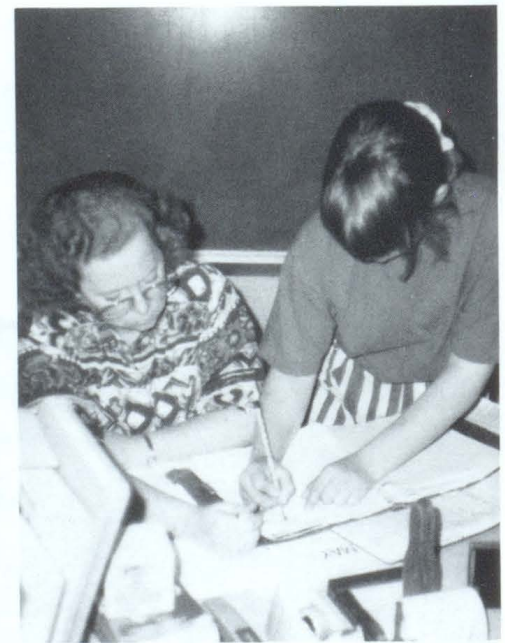

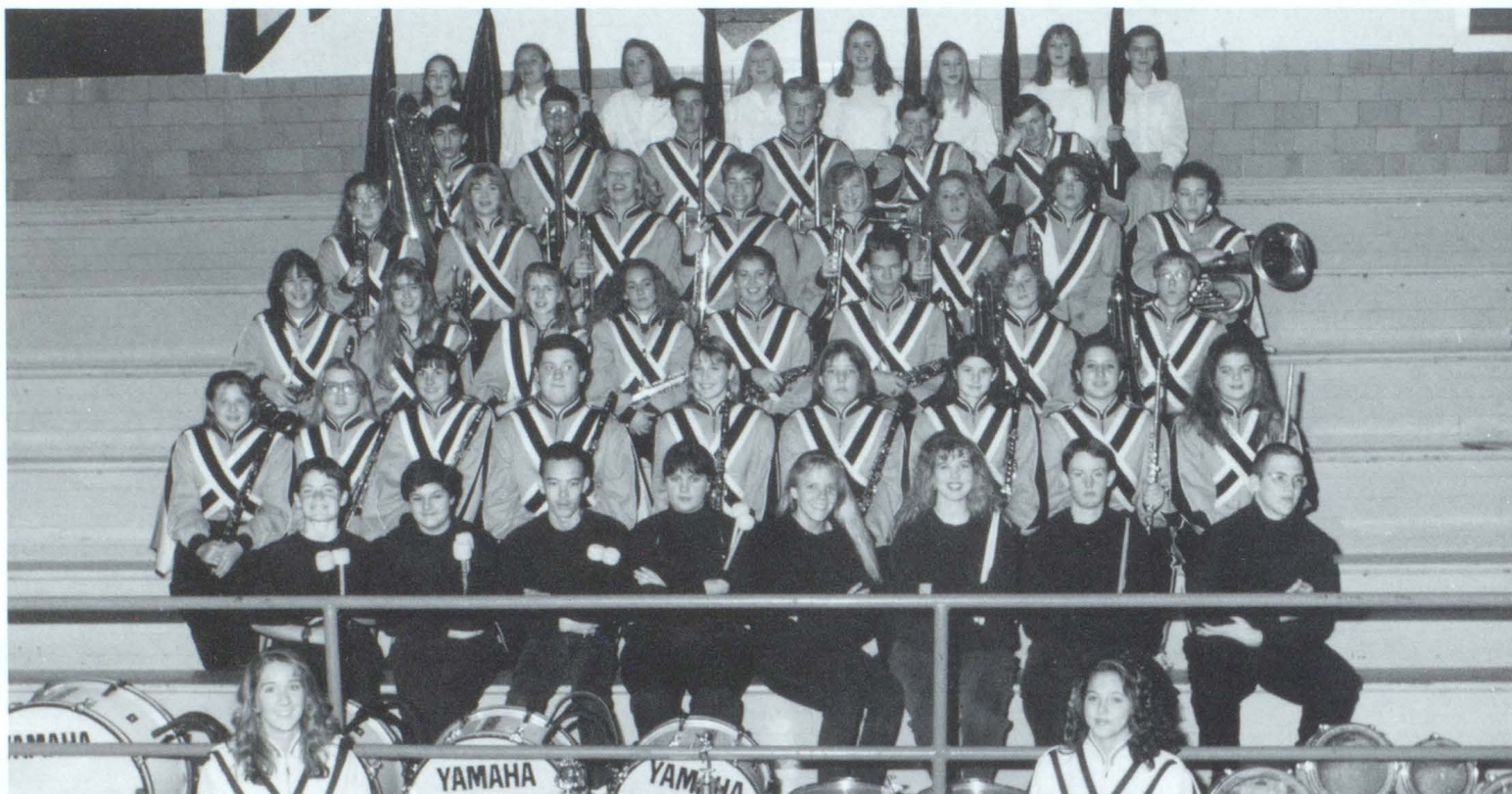

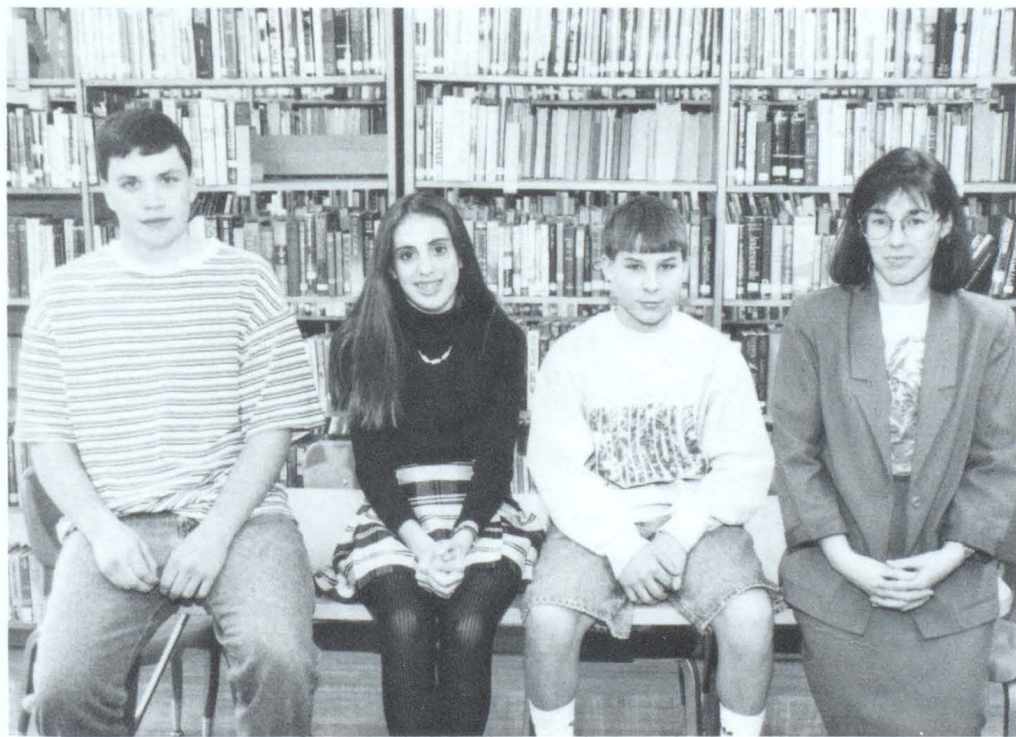

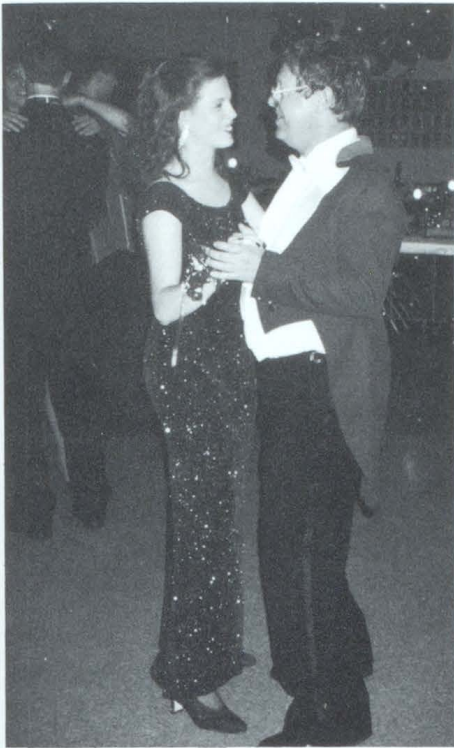

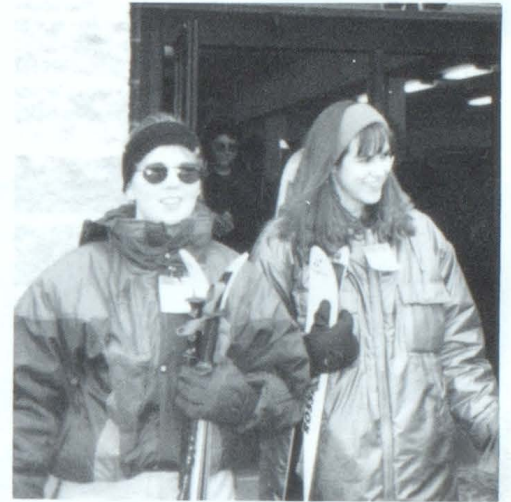

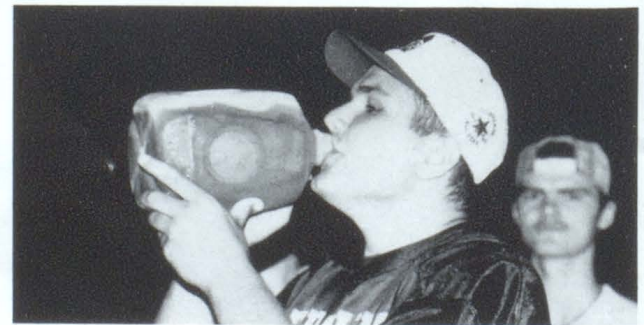

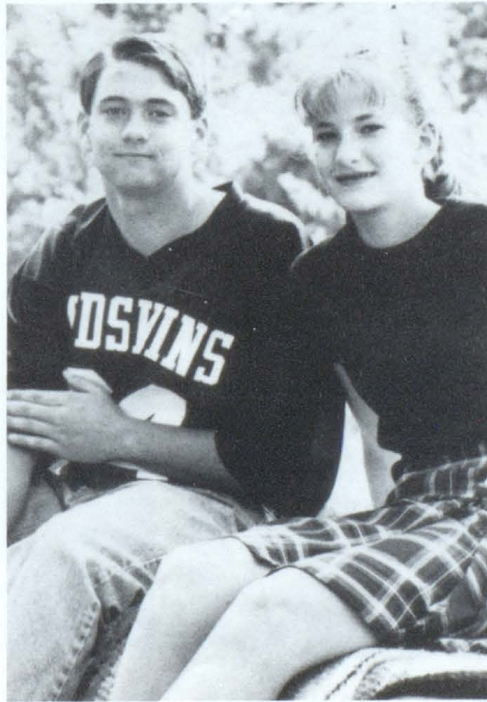

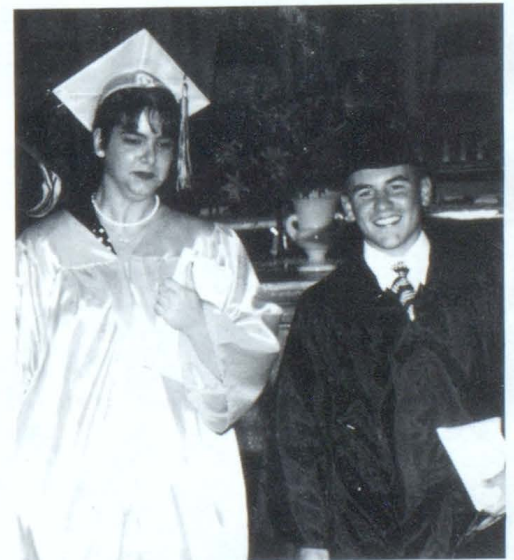

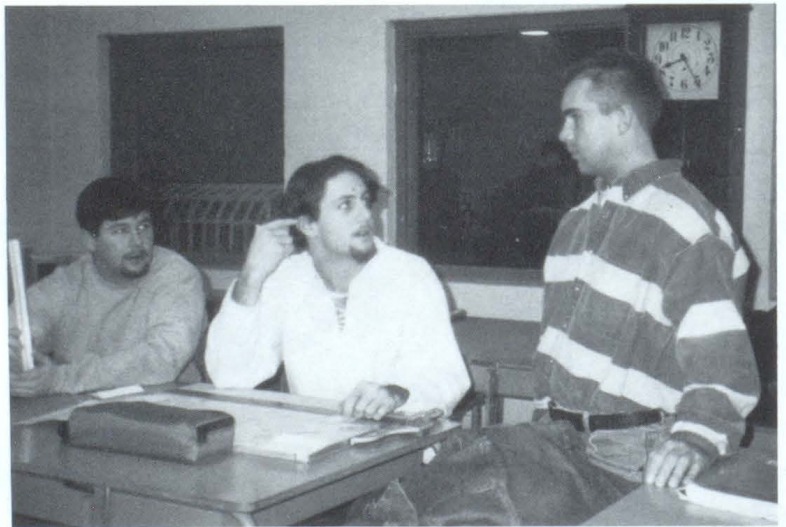

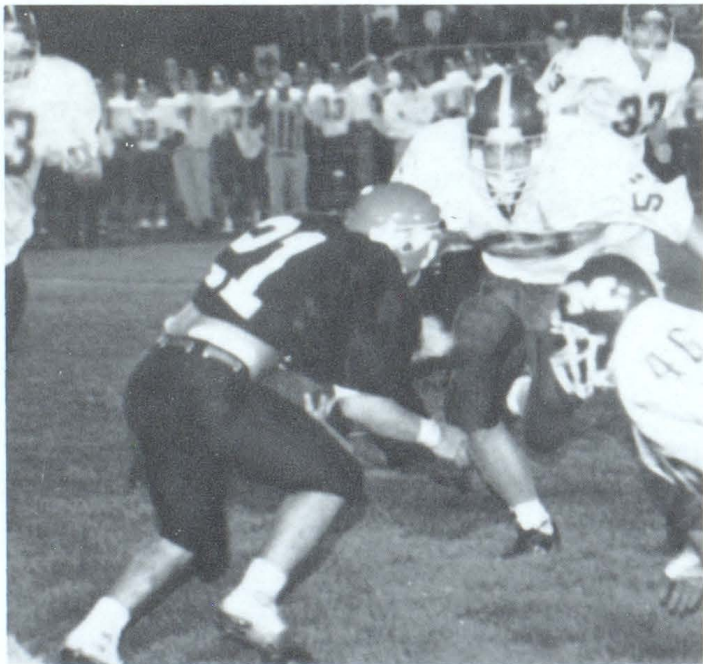

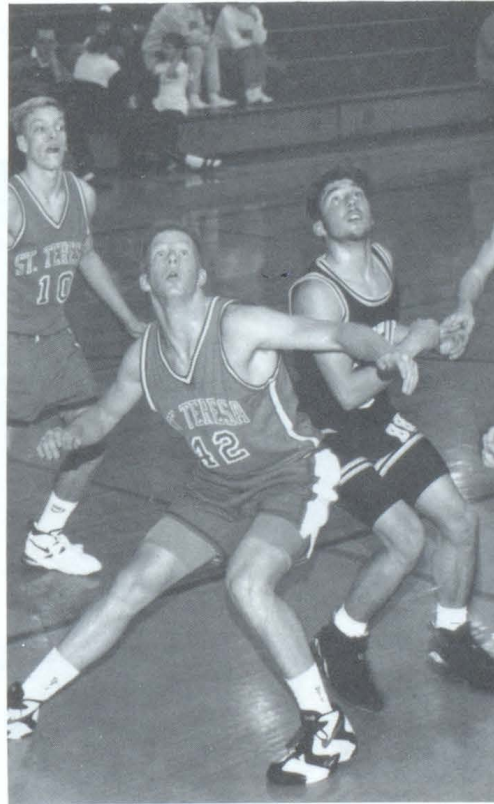

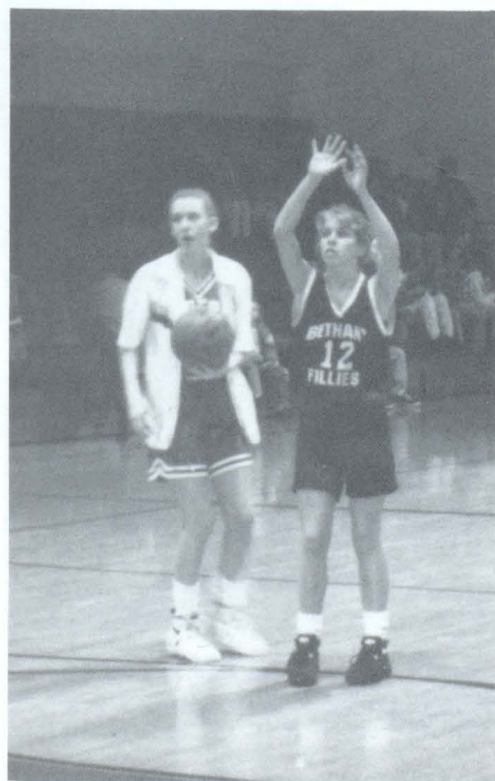

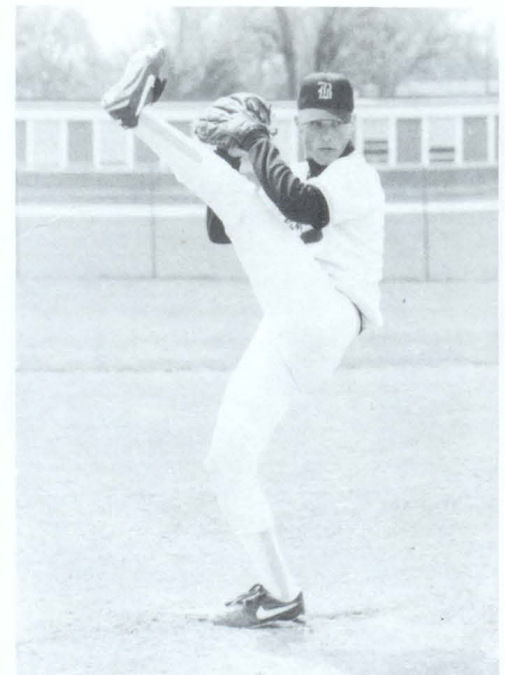

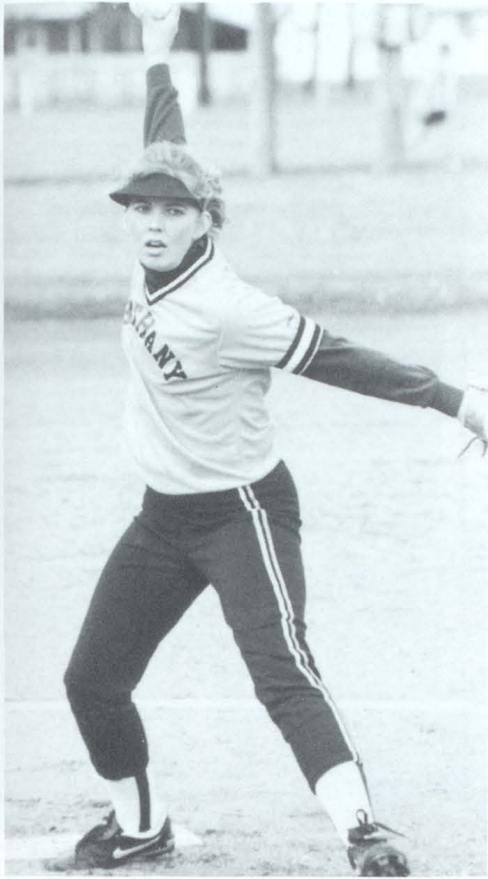

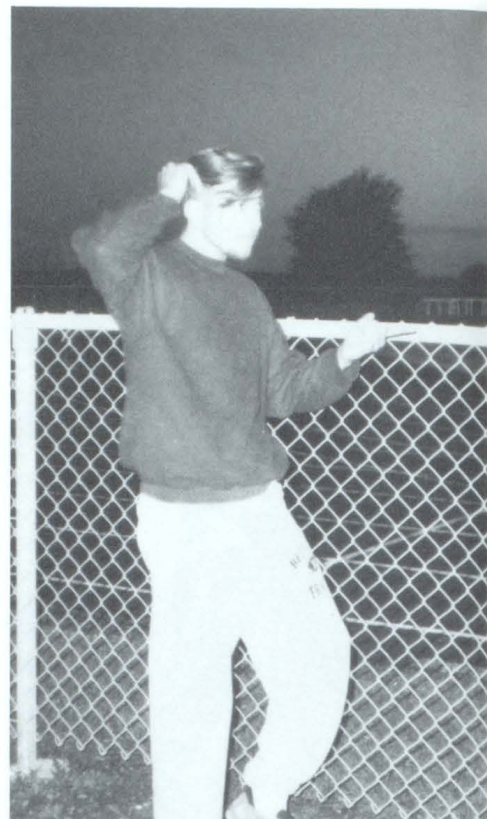

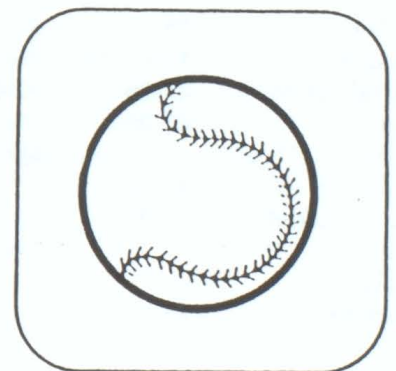

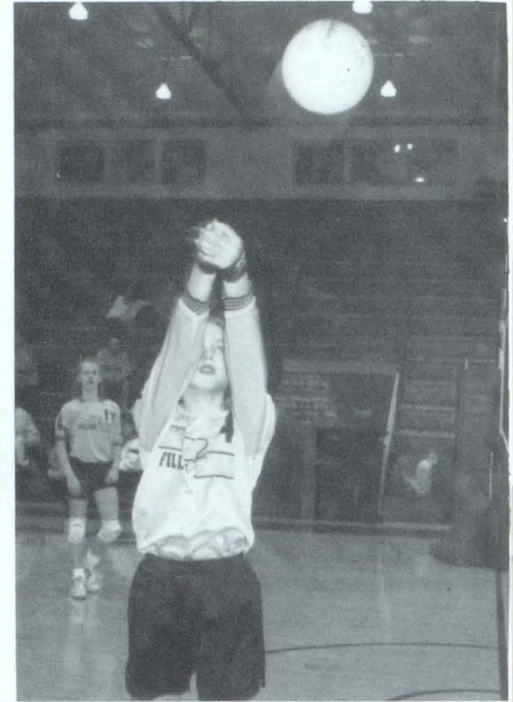

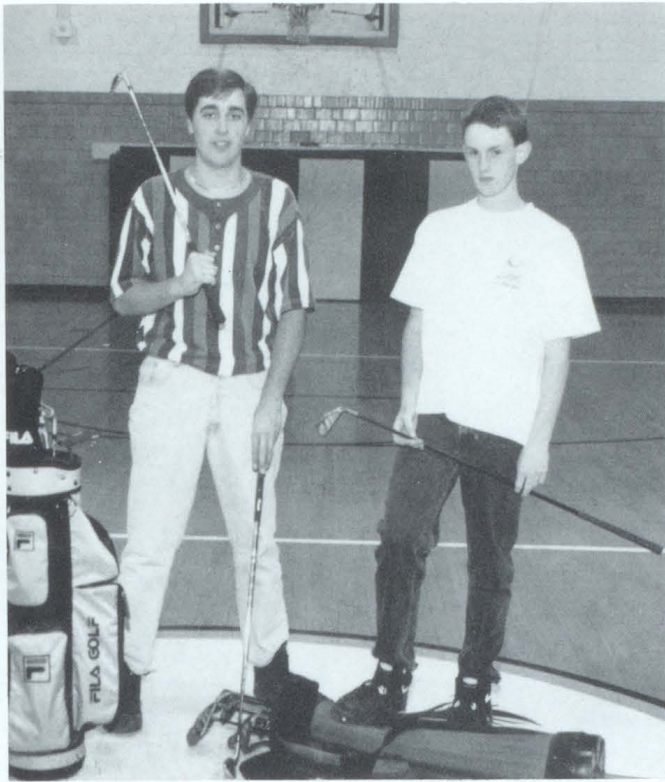

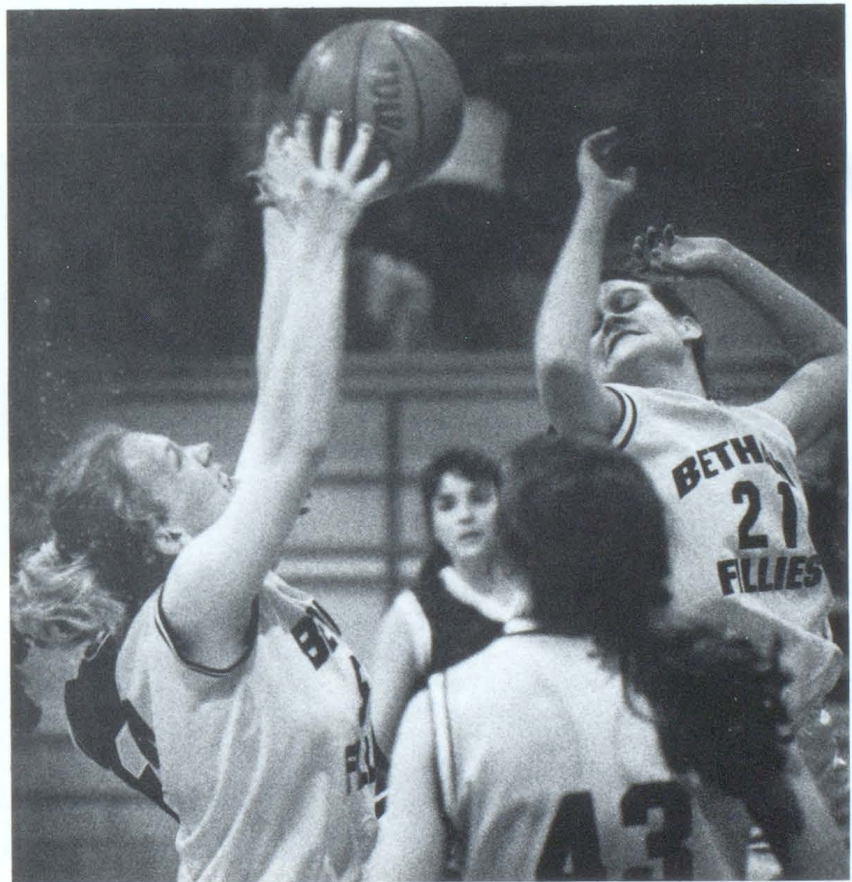

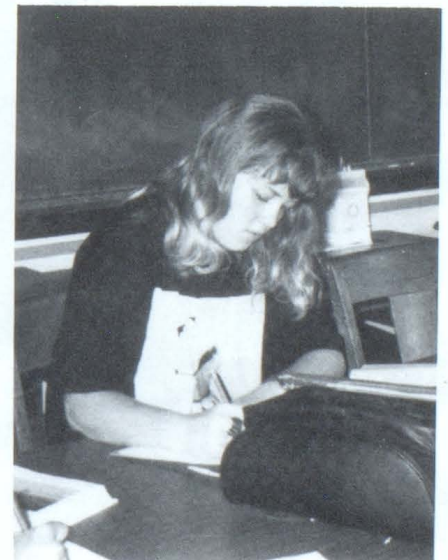
